Current Status of 4NANT Students in TPSS

45% of the 4NANT cohort has secured EAE admissions to ITE in either Nitec or Higher Nitec courses.

AFTER RESULT RELEASE

Scenario #1

Student **successfully** secures EAE and is offered the EAE.

When student opens the letter, they will be able to see that they have been offered their EAE course.

No further action is needed on their part unless...

- (1) They want to revoke the offer and come back to TPSS for Sec 5.
- (2) They want to revoke the offer and move to DPP/PFP (Refer to next slide).



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

QN: A Sec 4NA student has accepted his offer from ITE EAE but has qualified for DPP or PFP. Can he apply for DPP or PFP and retain his ITE EAE place?

ANS: Students who receive a DPP offer will be required to decide between the DPP or ITE EAE offer. Students who do not decide by the stipulated deadline will be deemed to have accepted their DPP offer and their ITE EAE offer will be released.

As applications to the PFP open in January, students with confirmed ITE EAE offers may progress to ITE first before applying for PFP when applications open. Students who subsequently receive a PFP offer may withdraw from their ITE EAE course.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Qn: Can I apply for both DPP and PFP?

Ans: You can apply for both DPP and PFP. However, if you are offered a place in both the DPP and PFP, you may only accept one course offer. Students who accept both offers will have their offers voided.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

QN: I have accepted the ITE EAE offer. Can I change to another 2-year Nitec/3-year Higher Nitec course after my N-level results release?

ANS: For successful EAE applicants who indicated acceptance during the acceptance phase, they will not be able to join the JIE 'N' intake. You will not be able to change the course as resources have been committed upon your acceptance of the course.

AFTER RESULT RELEASE

Scenario #2

Student **does not manage to keep the EAE offer** as MER of course is not met.

When student opens the letter, they will be able to see that they have not met the MER of the course. They may also receive an email from the course stating that their place in EAE has been revoked. Student to **appeal** to ITE to reinstate them in the course **and at the same time**, choose another ITE course in JIE.

AFTER RESULT RELEASE

Scenario #3

Student **takes OOS subjects** and must wait for O Level Result release to decide.

Students in this scenario will be granted special provision to wait till O Level result release to decide to keep their EAE, try for PFP/DPP or come back to TPSS for Sec 5.

POST-RESULTS RELEASE: HOW DO I CHOOSE COURSES WISELY?



STEP 1

Consider your Values, Interests, Personality & Skills (VIPS) and how they align with options or courses you are eligible for.

STEP 2

Explore and research on options:

- Subject contents & syllabus / course objectives & modules
- Progression opportunities
- Career prospects

STEP 3

Consider chances of being posted into desired courses in JCs/MI, Polytechnics and/or ITE, using the *last aggregate scores as a reference.

*For last aggregate scores, refer to JAE/JIE booklet

STEP 4

Shortlist up to 12 choices, ensuring that you include at least a few choices* where you stand a high chance of being posted to.

STEP 5

Rank your 12 choices according to your preferences.

How should you make your 12 choices for JIE”

How should you make your 12 choices for the JAE/ JIE?

First 3 to 4 choices: Consider courses that most align with your Values, Interests, Personality and Skills (V.I.P.S) and strengths.

Next 3 to 4 choices: Choose what you are interested in and stand a good chance of getting into. Consider the last aggregate scores of the courses (where your net score is within the range of last year's aggregate score). You can use **Course Finder** or **School Finder** to find out the aggregate scores.

Last 3 to 4 choices: Include alternative courses and institutions where the last aggregate scores are higher than yours. With this, your chances of securing a place will be higher.



- ▷ **ELMAB3** is applicable to admission/progression to majority of options available to **4NA** students
 - **NFP** (NAFA Foundation Programme)
 - **PFP** (Polytechnic Foundation Programme)
 - **DPP** (Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme)
 - **Secondary 5**
- ▷ **E**nglish **L**anguage, **M**athematics, **B**est **3** other subjects
- ▷ Grade **6** will not be considered i.e. at least Grade 5 for all subjects used in computation of the **ELMAB3** aggregate score

NAFA Foundation Programme for 4NA (NFP)

- ▷ **Gross ELMAB3 \leq 15**
- ▷ **English grade \geq 4:** will be required to attend an interview
- ▷ Must pass an **admission test or audition + submit portfolio**, depending on course
- ▷ Applicants may be asked to attend an **interview**
- ▷ Successful: Provisional offer of admission to the diploma courses
- ▷ Successful completion of NFP: Offered a place in chosen diploma
- ▷ **Currently**, students are only allowed to **select 1 course** of choice

Progression to Secondary 5 ('O'-level) for 4NA

Sec 5

- ▷ Gross ELMAB3 ≤ 19
- ▷ Points of consideration
 - Possible **gap** between 'N'-level and 'O'-level grades
 - While entry to option of choice after 'O'-level is **not guaranteed**, a **wide variety of options is available**:
 - Arts Institutions, e.g. LaSalle & NAFA
 - ITE – *Nitec* and *Higher Nitec*
 - Polytechnic – Diploma
 - Junior College / Millennia Institute – 'A'-level
 - PFP & DPP caters only to students of the preceding cohort
- ▷ **What is my projected 'O'-level results and options from there?**

Empower students with a **sense of hope** to consider new possibilities.



Polytechnic Foundation Programme for 4NA

PFP

- ▷ One-year programme, providing an **alternative to Sec 5**
- ▷ PFP admissions exercise will **commence in January 2024** following the release of the GCE O-Level examination results
- ▷ **Eligible Secondary 4 Normal (Academic) students will receive a copy of 'Form P'**
- ▷ Caters to students of the **Sec 4N(A) cohort in the preceding year** (i.e 2023)
- ▷ For same subject at both N- & O-Level, better grade will be used

Higher Nitec (via DPP) for 4NA

Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

- ▷ Proceed to (2-year) *Higher Nitec* course at ITE
- ▷ May use 'O'-Level prelim results (if applicable)
 - Same subject at both N- & O-Level, **better** grade will be used
 - 'O'-Level results **will be verified for continuation in DPP**
- ▷ Up to **12 choices (course and college)**
 - E.g. *Higher Nitec in Accounting* at **College Central** and at **College West** are taken as **2 choices**



Higher Nitec (via DPP) for 4NA

- ▷ If the application is successful:
 - January: **10-week** preparatory course
 - April: **2-year Higher Nitec** course
- ▷ Assured of a place in a related polytechnic course, **subject to achieving the qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA)**
- ▷ May apply for DPP & JIE-N (*Nitec* & *3-year Higher Nitec* courses) **concurrently – 2 separate admission exercises** on ITE website
- ▷ If **DPP** application is **successful**: *Nitec* & *3-year Higher Nitec* course will **not be offered**
- ▷ Please refer to **ITE website** and latest **ITE Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) booklet** for more information

Aggregate score of the lowest ranked students who were admitted the previous year

A total of 19 points or less for English Language, Mathematics and 3 other subjects (ELMAB3) in the GCE 'N(A)' examinations

For the ELMAB3 aggregate score, you must get:

- Grade 1-4 in English Language
- Grade 1-4 in Mathematics
- Grade 1-5 in the 3 other subjects

Bonus Points for 2-year *Nitec* & 3-year *Higher Nitec*

- ▷ **Not taken into account** when considering whether applicants are eligible for courses.
- ▷ **Come into effect only** when the applicant is **deemed eligible** and is being considered for posting based on merit.

Traineeship Scheme – Overview

- ▷ 1 to 2 years formal training arrangement involving three parties:
 - the trainee (student)
 - the employer
 - ITE
- ▷ Two components:
 - Off-the-job training: ITE or Approved Training Centre (ATC)
 - On-the-job training: actual work environment


